Mr. Ravi Ganeshan's Visit to Asha Niketan Bangalore for Vocational Program Development





We have learned so much from them, especially how to approach life with positivity and perseverance.

Asha Niketan, true to its mission, focuses not on the limitations of its members but on their abilities. The community has recognized and nurtured their talents, allowing them to grow and express themselves freely. The empowerment they experience is visible as they thrive and work towards reaching their full potential, regardless of their disabilities. As students, our time at Asha Niketan has been transformative. We have come to understand the value of human relationships in a way we never had before. The bonds we've formed here are special, and the lessons we've learned about life, acceptance, and understanding will stay with us forever.
